Here are a few places to visit before or after the conference for those who have time.



Fort Gratiot Lighthouse

Did you know that Michigan's oldest lighthouse, Fort Gratiot Lighthouse, is less than a mile from the Blue Water Convention Center? Furthermore, you can climb the Fort Gratiot Lighthouse! The view is incredible and the prices are reasonable. \$12 for an adult and \$10.80 for children and seniors. Guests who climb the lighthouse will get a panoramic view of the surrounding area with views of the Blue Water Convention Center, Lake Huron, and perhaps a Great Lakes freighter. <u>https://www.phmuseum.org/fort-gratiot-lighthouse/</u>



Thomas Edison Depot Museum

Do you recognize the name of the famous inventor, Thomas Edison? Thomas' boyhood home was Port Huron, Michigan. Just outside the Blue Water Convention Center is the Thomas Edison Depot Museum. It is located inside the historic Fort Gratiot train depot and was built in 1858 by the Grand Trunk Railway. This is the actual depot that Thomas Edison worked out of as a boy. Outside the depot a restored baggage car rests on a spur of railroad track. Inside this baggage car you can view a

re-creation of young Edison's mobile chemistry lab and printing shop. The museum is free to visit but a \$3.00 donation is suggested by the museum.

HURON Lightship Museum

Do you know what a lightship is? Lightships were floating lighthouses that were anchored in areas where it was too deep, expensive, or impractical to construct a lighthouse. They displayed a light at the top of a mast and in areas of fog sounded a fog signal and radio beacon. The HURON Lightship was the last operating lightship on the Great Lakes and served for over 50 years when she was retired in 1970. The lightship is about a 15 minute walk along the river from

the Blue Water Convention Center. The lightship is free but a \$3.00 donation is suggested by the museum. <u>https://www.phmuseum.org/huron-light-ship-museum/</u>
